1 Creation

The first way we can see that God loves us is Creation.

would God give a special 24 hr period to do no work, except that he wanted to spend time with us? Now which of you when you fell in love with your spouse or fiancé' wanted to spend all of your time with them? Or which of you have children that will never leave you alone because they are constantly bugging to play with them. We even see this love between friends. I love to hang out with my friends. I'm always asking my mom and dad if I can go do something with one of them. If I didn't love my friends, I wouldn't want to be with them all of the time. Everyone who loves wants to spend time with the one they love. And God is no different He wants to spend time with you constantly.

2 Jesus's Ministry

Another way we can see that God loves us is how Jesus treated people while He was living as a human on earth. He gave a lot while he was here on earth. He did tons of things. You see, God will accept you no matter what your past life was, even if you choose not to have faith and love Him, he still loves you and stands today offering you your ticket to eternal life. But, if you want eternal life, you must accept the gift, the ticket to heaven. He is your ticket to that eternal happiness and if you have that faith in Him, He will give you that ticket.

Ephesians 2:8 said that we are saved "BY FAITH." To get the ticket you simply believe. Trust God to open the door of our prison called sin and death.

If that's your desire, would you check the box next to the statement, "I once knew Jesus, but have drifted away. I recommit my life to Jesus."

Maybe you've never taken that step of accepting Christ. But you'd like to do that now. If that's your desire, check the box next to the statement, "I repent of my sins and accept Jesus as my personal Saviour, believing that my sins are forgiven and His gift of eternal life is mine."

Perhaps, you're not ready to make that decision. Maybe you'd like to learn more about Jesus and what it means to follow Him. If that's the case, check the last box on the card.

Thank you. Now, I'm going to ask you to do one more thing. As we sing our closing hymn, would you bring your card up front and lay it down on the altar and kneel with me for prayer? We'll sing the first and last stanzas of "I Surrender All," number 309, so just

as soon as we begin singing the last stanza, make your way down front with me and let's talk to Jesus.
